DESPITE ADVERSITIES, CFFL STUDENT FORGES FORWARD

Dedication. Perseverance. Determination. These qualities are ever-present in Children First Family Literacy Student Angel. Angel began studying for her GED in the CFFL program in July of 2016. Having completed high school through the eleventh grade, she wanted to show her daughter, Nevaeh, an infant at the time, that literacy and education are the keys to moving out of poverty and opening up greater opportunities for both of them. In the beginning, Angel was quite reserved, having built up a wall of protection against any anticipated failures. With much encouragement from her teachers as well as her classmates, that wall eventually began to come down.



There have been many challenges along the way for Angel in her journey toward GED attainment. She was a single parent when she enrolled, juggling an infant and trying to find adequate study time. Unlike most students who enjoyed the comfort of their own vehicle to get to class, Angel lacked reliable transportation and would often take the city bus with Nevaeh and a stroller – no easy task. However, she was determined not to miss class, as she never lost sight of her ultimate goal. When Angel eventually found a part-time job, she would often go to work in the evenings and work overnight after attending class, going home and putting Nevaeh to bed, and hopping back on the bus. She showed this same level of resolve every night in class. In the words of one of Angel's instructors, "Her perseverance and dedication are unparalleled. In all my years with the program, there is

not anyone who can match her tenacity."

Angel remains in the CFFL program and has passed both the Civics and the Social Studies tests to date. She continues to work hard to master the remaining subject matter with the same doggedness that she approaches everything in her life. Not only does she work extremely hard, she also encourages others to do the same. When she passes a test, she comes back to class and reassures her classmates that they too can be successful and not to give up. If she fails a test, she just works that much harder to pass it the second time around.

Rarely has there been a student who more graciously exemplifies hard work, dedication and resilience in spite of adversity. Though she has not quite reached her goal of GED attainment, Angel is absolutely a success story in the truest sense!
