From the Executive Director: History of Literacy Green Bay Chapter 2: ESL or Basic Literacy?



Not all the adults seeking our help were refugees or immigrants needing to learn English. We soon realized that many local adults had low basic skills, might have had a high school diploma, but still struggled with reading, or had not finished school and dropped out. Additional tutors were recruited and trained to teach basic reading and writing skills. For several years, our tutors were identified as

either an ESL tutor or a Basic Literacy tutor. In 1998, that changed when the 2 training workshops were combined, allowing for more flexibility and versatility for the tutors.

According to US Census Fact Finder, it is estimated that **9.4% of** the population in Brown County, 25 and older, lacks a high school diploma. That number does not include those who have a high school diploma but still have low literacy skills. Having low literacy skills has been identified as a key driver for poverty. We agree. Our tutors and staff have witnessed how our students' improved skills, increases in reading proficiency, or GED attainment has led to self-sufficiency through employment, higher wages, vocational certificates and equally important, self-confidence.

14th Annual Scrabble Bee

Over 250 people attended our largest fundraiser of the year. This year over \$46,000 was raised to support our adult and family literacy programs in Brown County.





The evening began with dinner and a presentation by one of our adult learners, Emelina Bebeau. Emelina shared the story of her journey and how Literacy Green Bay and her tutor assisted her in achieving her goals of speaking better English, obtaining a job working with children and entering an associate's degree program at NWTC.

Following dinner, our Master of Ceremonies, Lisa Malak of WFRV-TV Local 5 Live, and our auctioneer Jim Stamatakos began the oral auction, which had great items like Milwaukee Bucks tickets, Supper Club at Home package, Weekend in Wisconsin Dells, Door County Weekend and Golf at Kohler. In addition to the oral auction, there was also a silent auction, bucket raffle and a restaurant raffle.





Once the oral auction was completed, two rounds of Scrabble took place. Each round had a different theme to which the words had to apply. Thank you to the 28 teams who came out to play.

Somali Class

Literacy Green Bay received two grants from Resurrection Parish and the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation to support our classes for low level Somalis. The students in this class never learned to read or write in their native languages, so they need more support than what we offer in a typical ELL class.





Child Tutoring Program

Literacy Green Bay is holding a child tutor training on Saturday, April 2nd from 9 - 11 a.m. in our Learning Center. Child tutors are high school and college students who work with the first through fifth grade children of our adult ELL and GED learners. We ask for a once a week commitment from the volunteers.
